Goal

San Diego Regional Economic Development Corporation and stakeholders will adopt a strategy to address one of two acute workforce shortages prioritized by the EDC Board of Directors:

- Nursing and Allied Health professions
- Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) professions

Outcomes

- Ensure equal amounts of STEM graduates to support regional STEM needs.
- EDC will prioritize two STEM policy initiatives: a regional STEM education strategy and a college and career readiness campaign.
- EDC proposes to establish a regional STEM strategy - the product of a STEM forum engaging school district leaders, educators, policy makers, STEM industry leaders, and all other stakeholders
 - Regional consensus for improved performance: identify programs that can accomplish improvement on scale needed for regional competitiveness
- Champion Support of SDCOE's College and Career Readiness Campaign
 - Support A-G curriculum reform initiative, led by the San Diego County Office of Education (SDCOE), at a funding capacity to reform high school graduation requirements.
